EIGHT WAYS TO ASK A QUESTION WELL

- Ask one question at a time.
- Cut the intro and ask the question.
- Should you ask a rhetorical question?

 Does a one-legged duck swim in circles?
- Stick to questions starting with "What".
- Get comfortable with silence.
- Actually listen to the answer.
- Acknowledge the answers you get.
- Use any and every channel to ask a question.





HOW TO BE GENEROUS WITH YOUR APPRECIATION

We're (mostly) pretty decent at telling people when they've done a good job. We're less good at taking the time to appreciate the whole person in front of us. It takes courage and empathy and vulnerability to say to someone, this is who I see, when I see you. This list isn't complete, but it might be a springboard for you to find your words and use them

... stop you there

so that you can stay curious

... and ask you a question
